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# TAGGED DIALOGUE: OTHER WAYS TO SAY "SHE SAID" OR "HE SAID."

what's going on, instead of telling them, one way to give your readers clues is to use special tags instead of the usual "she said, he said." The dialogue tags we use can add hidden meaning and plot clues to our writing. Because authors are supposed to show their readers
