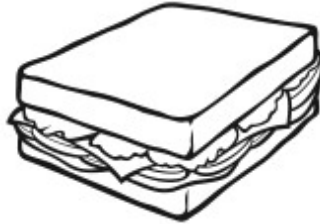


Sandwich Book Project



This project will require you to create a sandwich book that captures the setting, main characters, and author's style. You will also include evidence to support your feelings and thoughts about the book.

Requirements:

1. Bread Top: Write the book title, author, illustrator (if there is one), and your name.
2. Lettuce: Write a one-paragraph (6-8 sentence) summary of the book.
3. Tomato: Describe or draw the book's setting.
4. Meat: Describe the main character in one paragraph (6-8 sentences).
5. Cheese: Write about a part of the book that made you happy.
6. Onion: Describe a part of the book that you thought was sweet or sad. Also, write what you thought of the book.
7. Bread Bottom: Tell what you liked or didn't like about the author's style.
8. Last put your sandwich together. Fasten it all together with a brad or a ring.

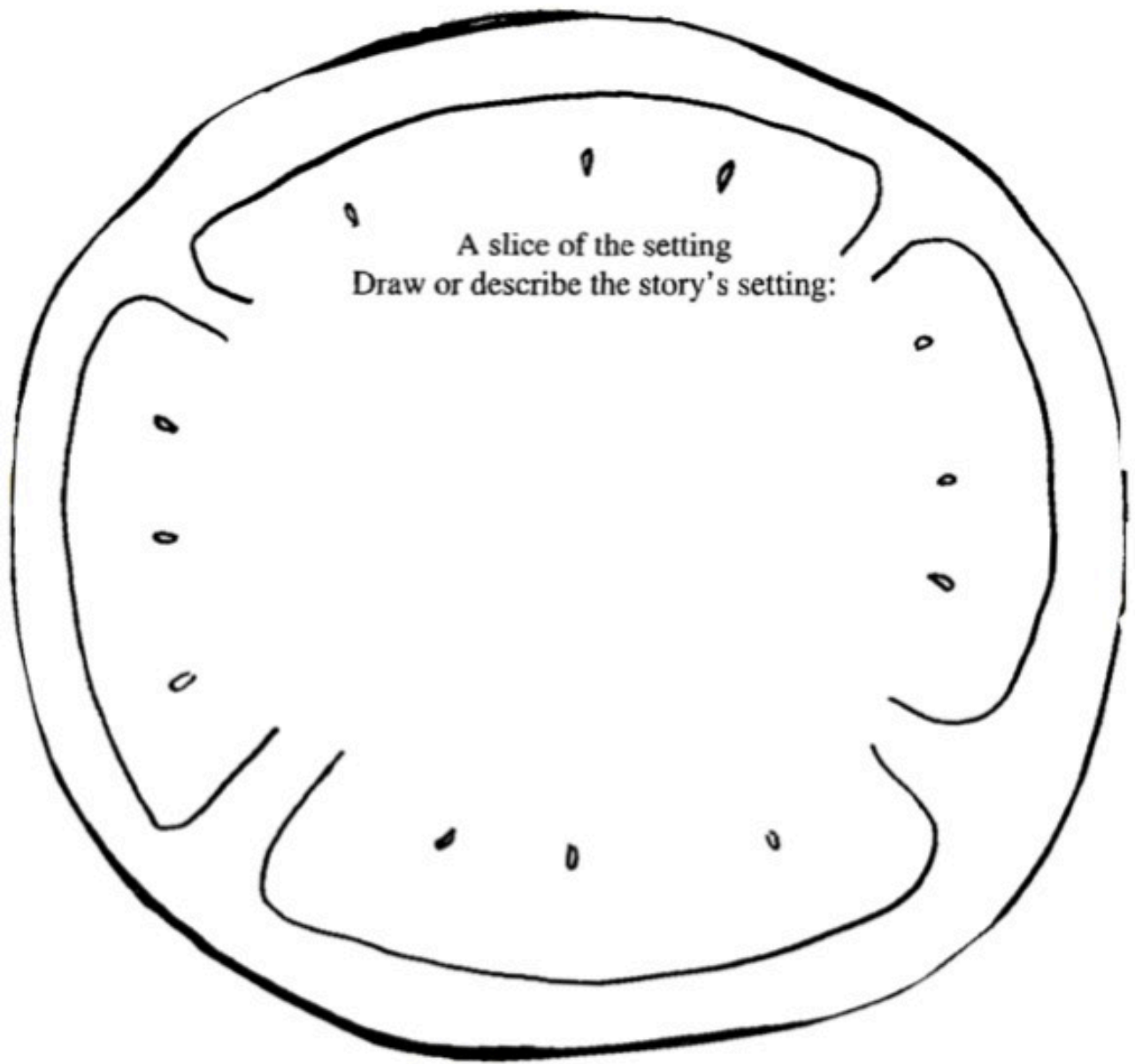

Lettuce (summary)	Attempted to “retell” story by listing details that have little or nothing to do with the main idea. There were a lot of sentence fragments or run-on sentences.	Summary contained several irrelevant detail sentences that could have been omitted. There were many mistakes.	Summary contained the beginning, middle, and end. However, there were 1-2 irrelevant details that could have been omitted. There were 1-2 grammar mistakes.	Summary contained the beginning, middle, and end. Included relevant details. Wrote without grammar and spelling mistakes.
Meat (character)	Listed several descriptive words, but did not write about the character in main sentences.	The main character described in terms of either personality OR physical description, not both. There were several grammatical errors.	The main character was partially described. Mentioned physical characteristics and personality, but did not provide evidence from the text to support the thinking. There were 1-2 grammatical errors.	The main character was fully described in terms of both physical characteristics and personality. Used evidence from the text to support the thinking. Wrote a paragraph with complete sentences.
Cheese (part that made you happy)	Written in complete sentences, and described a part of the book, but did not explain the feelings. There were several grammatical errors.	Written in complete sentences, and described a part of the book, but did not explain the feelings. There were 1-2 grammatical mistakes.
